### ***Switch to Canvas***

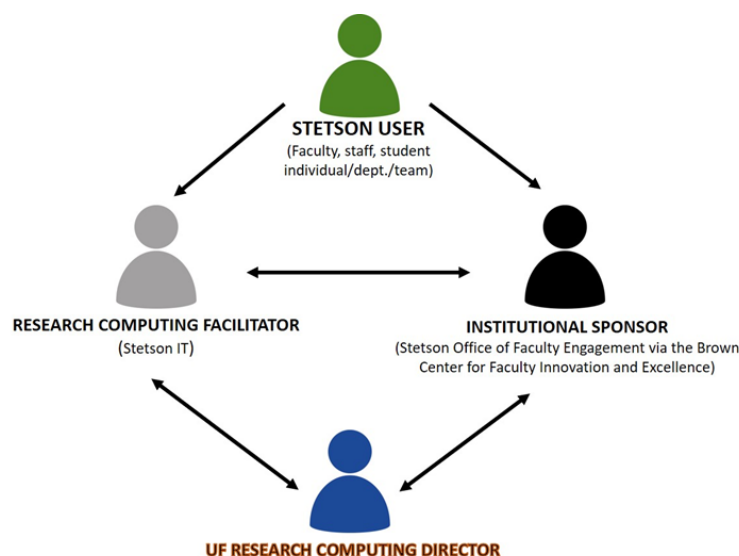
The university will transition to the Canvas LMS platform in time for the beginning of summer classes. The Office of Online Learning and Educational Technology (OOLET) has created a [Canvas](#) resource webpage to post information about workshops and resources such as tutorials. Bookmark OOLET's Canvas resource page and check it regularly for updates and scheduling information. Contact the [OOLET](#) team to learn how to begin to familiarize yourself with Canvas. The College of Law has also created a wonderful guide to help faculty transition their courses to Canvas. Visit the [College of Law's Blackboard Migration to Canvas site](#) to learn more. The OOLET team will transfer existing content from Blackboard to Canvas, but the instructor still needs to check it and make any necessary changes. These resources will help make learning how to use Canvas easier. Thirty-six workshops are being offered Monday – Friday from April 5<sup>th</sup> to the 30<sup>th</sup> over a variety of times. The Brown Center plans to supplement OOLET's Canvas programming by creating a resource library of tutorials and recorded webinars. ### ***Access to the University of Florida HiPerGator AI Supercomputer***

Through its membership in the **Florida Research Development Alliance** (FloRDA), Stetson University will have limited access to the University of Florida HiPerGator AI supercomputer resource. Access was effective March 1, 2021. Initially, Stetson will receive a 6-month university-wide allocation of 64 CPU cores (NCU), 32 GPU cards (NGU) and 10 TB of storage. For more information about this computational resource refer to the [HiPerGator](#) webpage at the UF Computer Center. During the past several weeks work has been underway to accomplish the following:

- 1) Create a streamlined registration process for those members of the Stetson community interested in using this computational resource.
- 2) Provide a bridge between Stetson users and the UF computing center to facilitate set-up of an account and use of this resource.

Referred to as Stetson HiPerGator AI liaisons (See figure), the Research Computing Facilitator (RCF), Vikram Ahmed (vahmed@stetson.edu) will provide assistance to SU users to help them navigate the process of creating an account and effectively using the system. The Institutional Sponsor (IS), Harry Price (hprice@stetson.edu) provides administrative oversight of Stetson's HiPerGator account on behalf of the associate provost's office and will "sign off" on user applications. The IS will receive monthly reports about usage of the university's HiPerGator account.



Once a HiPerGator AI account is activated, a Stetson user should not have to communicate directly with the UF computer Center. If you are interested in using the HiPerGator resource as part of a class, learn more about how to setup a course at the UF computer center's ["Teaching Support"](#) page.
