What is microlearning? <u>Microlearning</u> is a skills-based training approach that delivers specific content over a short period of time. Learners can study at their convenience. Content can take many forms, but is should always be short. The education-focused company, OneHE has partnered with the AAC&U to make ONeHE's resources more accessible for faculty. OneHE provides evidence-based courses and resources that enhance teaching practice. Learn more about this <u>partnership</u> and explore some of the <u>free resources</u>. When viewing the free resources, make sure to scroll to the bottom of the page to see the complete list of activities and free resources. Other courses and resources are available and can be access via a 10-day free trial. If you like the OneHE courses and want to continue, make sure you cancel your free trial and contact the Brown Center director or Program Manager. A limited amount of funds is available to purchase monthly licenses. The Brown Center will support requests on a first come first serve basis until funds run out.
