James H. Johnson, Jr. is the William R. Kenan Jr. Distinguished Professor of Strategy and Entrepreneurship and director of the Urban Investment Strategies Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His current research and consulting activities focus on the workforce and workplace implications of post-1990 demographic changes in the U.S; and on how to create highly competitive and sustainable business enterprises and communities in the current era of economic uncertainty and global insecurity. His research on these and related topics has been widely cited in a number of national media outlets, including the *New York Times*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Dr. Johnson* has been selected by *Fast Company* magazine as one of the "17 ... brightest thinkers and doers in the new world of work," *Wall Street Journal*, *Washington Post*, *Detroit Free Press*, *Newsweek*, *Time Magazine*, *U.S. News and World Report*, and *Business Week*. He has also appeared on a number of national television shows, including *The Today Show* on NBC, *CNN Headline News*, *the CBS Evening News*, *ABC Nightly News*, *Sunday Morning* on CBS, *This Week in Review* on NBC, and *North Carolina People with William Friday*. Prior to joining the UNC-Chappell Hill faculty, Dr. Johnson spent the first twelve years of his professional career as professor at the University of California, Los Angeles. He is the author of several scholarly articles, and his most recent book is *Prismatic Metropolis: Inequality in Los Angeles*. James H. Johnson, Jr. holds degrees from North Carolina Central University (B.S., 1975), the University of Wisconsin at Madison (MS, 1977), and Michigan State University (PhD, 1980).

During the third annual Faculty Learning Community Day, Dr. Johnson will present his research on demographic developments that already have begun to change the face of higher education. With profound implications for Stetson University as a community and particularly the work of the faculty, these developments will challenge us to reimagine our work and indeed our lives. He will encourage us to develop timely responses to the demographic changes that we are already experiencing, and most importantly, to embrace inclusive excellence as we prepare for our future.
